1. **arrive:** to reach one's destination.

2. **measure:** finding out the length or capacity of something using a rule or standard, or to compare or judge.

3. **movement:** the act of changing position.

4. **satellite:** an object that revolves around another object in space.

5. **volcano**: a weak spot in the crust where magma has come to the surface.

6. **volcanoes:** plural of one volcano.

7. eruption: a big sudden release, bursting, or outward emotional release.

8. viscosity: a liquid's resistance to flowing.

9. crater: a bowl-shaped area that forms around a volcano's central opening.

10. **dormant:** a volcano that is not currently active, but may become active in the future.

11. **tomorrow:** the day that immediately follows the current one.

12. **extinct:** a volcano that is no longer active and is unlikely to erupt again; describes a type of organism that no longer exists on Earth.

13. **geyser:** a fountain of water and steam that builds up pressure underground and erupts at regular intervals.

14. **lecture:** The definition of a lecture is a talk given on a particular subject or a scolding given after someone does something wrong.

15. wait: to stay or remain in one place until something happens.
