- Plurals and Singular nouns in Spanish: the three rules for plural nouns.
- Masculine and feminine: the gender of the nouns and adjectives in Spanish.
- The Definite Articles in Spanish: El, La, Los, Las, Un, Uno, Unas, Unos.
